

The five (5) trustee zones for Kuna Jt. School District No. 3 will be as follows:

ZONE 1: Beginning at the corner of Ten Mile Rd and Avalon Street; North on the centerline of Ten Mile Road to Boise Street; East on the centerline of Boise Street to Linder Road; North on the centerline of Linder Road to Deer Flat Road; East on the centerline of Deer Flat Road to Kay Avenue; South on the centerline of Kay Avenue to Avalon Street; East on the centerline of Avalon Street to its intersection with Kuna Road and continuing east on the centerline of Kuna Road (North edge of Section 25, T 02N, R01W and Section 30, T02N, R01W) to Strobel Road; South on the centerline of Strobel Road approximately 2 mile to Kuna Mora Road; West approximately 1.5 miles to Swan Falls Road; North on the centerline of Swan Falls Road to King Road; West on the centerline of King Road to School Avenue; North on the centerline of School Avenue to Avalon Street; West on Avalon Street to the point of beginning.

ZONE 2: Beginning at the corner of Ten Mile Road and Lake Hazel Road; East on northern boundary until its intersection with Kuna Meridian Road ; South on the centerline of Kuna Meridian Road (HWY 69) to Hubbard Road; West on the centerline of Hubbard Road to Linder Road; South on the centerline of Linder Road to Boise Street; West on the centerline of Boise Street to Ten Mile Road; North on the centerline of Ten Mile Road to Lake Hazel Road.

ZONE 3: Beginning at Linder Road and Hubbard Road; East on the centerline of Hubbard Road to Kuna Meridian Road (HWY 69); North on the centerline of HWY 69 to northern boundary; East along northern boundary to Cloverdale Road; South on Cloverdale Road to northern boundary; East along northern boundary to Five Mile Road (East Boundary); South on Five Mile Road (East Boundary) to Kuna Road; West on the centerline of Kuna Road to its intersection with Avalon Street and continuing west on the centerline of Avalon Street to Kay Ave; North on the centerline of Kay Avenue to Deer Flat Road; West on the centerline of Deer Flat Road to Linder Road; North on Linder Road to the point of beginning.

ZONE 4: Beginning at School Avenue and King Road; West on the centerline of King Road to Black Cat Road; North on the centerline of Black Cat Road to Kuna Road; West on the Centerline of Kuna Road to Track Road; North approximately .5 miles on the centerline of Track Road to the northern boundary; Follow Northwest boundary East to Robinson Road; North on Robinson to northern boundary; East on northern boundary to McDermott Road; North on McDermott Road to Amity Road; West on Amity Road to Robinson Road; North on Robinson Road to northern boundary; follow north and west boundary to McDermott Road; South on McDermott Road to northern boundary; East on northern boundary to east boundary; South on eastern boundary to Lake Hazel Road; East on Lake Hazel Road to Ten Mile Road; South on the centerline of Ten Mile Road to Kuna Road; East on the centerline of Kuna Road to School Avenue; South on the centerline of School Avenue to the point of beginning.

ZONE 5: Beginning on Northeast corner of district (NE corner of Section 32, T02N, R02E) South on Pleasant Valley Road; follow the boundary around to Northwest edge at Powerline Road and NW corner of the SW ¼ of Section 23, T02N,R02W; Go east .5 miles to the intersection of Track Road; Follow the centerline of Track Road south to Kuna Road; East on the centerline of Kuna Road to Black Cat; South on Black Cat to King Road; East on the centerline of King Road to Swan Falls Road; South on the centerline of Swan Falls Road to Kuna Mora Road; East 1.5 miles on the north edge of Section 1, T01N, R01W and Section 2,

T01N, R01W to Strobel Road; North on the centerline of Strobel Road to Kuna Road; East on the centerline of Kuna Road to Five Mile Road; South on Five Mile Road to Kuna Mora Road; East on Kuna Mora Road to Cole Road; North on Cole Road to northern boundary; East to the point of beginning.

REDEFINING TRUSTEE ZONES

The boundaries of the trustee zones in this district are to be defined and drawn so that, as reasonably as may be, each such zone shall have approximately the same population. Trustee zones in this district will be determined to have approximately the same population when the populations of each trustee zone do not vary by more than ten percent (10%).

A proposal to redefine and change trustee zones of this district may be initiated by the board of trustees or by petition signed by not less than fifty (50) school electors residing in the district. If initiated by the board of trustees, such proposal will be initiated at the first meeting following the report of the decennial census. A petition to redefine and change trustee zones may be submitted to the board of trustees at any time. Within one hundred twenty (120) days following the report of the decennial census or the receipt of a petition to redefine and change the trustee zones, the board will prepare a proposal for a change which will equalize the population in each trustee zone and submit the proposal to the State Board of Education. The proposal will include a legal description of each trustee zone as the same would appear pursuant to the proposal, a map of the district showing how each trustee zone would appear, and the approximate population each trustee zone would have, should the proposal become effective. Any proposal to redefine the boundaries of the several trustee zones shall include the determination, where appropriate, the number of trustee zones in each district, and the date of expiration of the term of office for each trustee.

The superintendent or designee will be authorized to review the decennial census, or any proposal to change trustee zone boundaries, and determine whether there has been a shift in population which causes the current trustee zones to not contain approximately the same populations. If it is determined that the population has changed so that the trustee zones are not of approximately the same population, the board will appoint a committee, composed of interested parties, to review the matter. The committee will propose to the board modifications to the trustee zone boundaries which are intended to equalize the population in the various trustee zones.

The State Board of Education will approve or disapprove of the proposal within sixty (60) days and give notice of its decision to the board of trustees in writing. If approved, the trustee zones will change pursuant to the proposal and the district must file a copy of the legal description of each redefined trustee zone and a map of the district showing how each trustee zone will appear with the county clerk. If disapproved, the board must submit a revised proposal to the State Board of Education within forty-five (45) days. Trustee zones may be redefined and changed not more than once every five (5) years.

IMPLEMENTATION OF PROPOSAL TO REDEFINE TRUSTEE ZONES

At the next regular meeting of the board following the approval of the proposal, the board will appoint from its membership a trustee for each new trustee zone to serve as trustee until that incumbent trustee's term expires. If the current board membership includes two (2) incumbent

trustees from the same new trustee zone, the board will select the incumbent trustee with the most seniority as the trustee to serve the remainder of his or her term. If both incumbent trustees have equal seniority, the board will choose one (1) of the trustees by the drawing of lots. If there is a trustee vacancy in any trustee zone, the board will appoint an individual residing in the trustee zone to serve as trustee until the next annual meeting. At the next trustee election, a trustee shall be elected to serve during the term specified in the election for the zone. The elected trustee shall assume office at the annual meeting of the board of trustees next following the election.
